DEVO TIONAL GUIDE

CONTEXT

01.

As you follow this devotional, each day will highlight the context of the verse of focus. Context allows us to quickly see the bigger picture. Understanding the context of scripture allows us to fully understand the principles God wants us to apply in our lives.



KEY VERSE(S)

02.

Now that we have the context, our next focus will be on a key verse or passage. Once you've read the key verse or passage, continue to read full chapter with the key verse in full context.

To dive deeper, read the previous and following chapter. Often you'll see a pattern or continuation of a principle in the Bible. Highlight and annotate things that stand out to you. Take time to process and ask questions about what you're observing in the verses.

If there's something you don't understand, reach out to a pastor, friend, team or small group leader!

ACTION

03.

This is where we apply and do something about what we have read and learnt.

Take a moment to review what you learnt and ask the question, 'What does God want me to do?'

For each day, you'll find some actions to help guide you in prayer. Spend time in a quiet place, play some worship music and really dedicate some quality time in prayer.

Then, 'GO' and apply what you've learned in your day to day life!

DEVOTIONAL

DAY 1 - GO BE A WITNESS

Context Jesus' instruction to His disciples to proclaim the Gospel to all creation.

Key Verse Mark 16:15 (ESV) "And he said to them, 'Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation.'"

Action Reflect on the significance of sharing the Gospel in your daily interactions. Consider how you might communicate God's love and salvation to those around you. Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the Good News with others.

DAY 2 - GO IN FAITH

Context God calls Abram (later known as Abraham) to leave his country, family, and father's household to go to a land that God would show him.

Key Verse Genesis 12:1 (ESV) Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you."

Action Consider reflecting on moments in your life when you felt a call or nudge to step into something new or challenging, akin to Abram's call. Pray for faith to trust in God even when it seems uncertain or demanding.

GO

DAY 3 - GO BEYOND EXPECTATION

Context Speaks about going the extra mile, giving generously and surpassing societal norms. Roman law required you to carry their bag for a mile.

Key Verse Matthew 5:40-42 (ESV) “And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles. Give to the one who begs from you, and do not refuse the one who would borrow from you.”

Action Reflect on times when you've gone above and beyond what was expected of you. Pray for a generous and compassionate heart that willingly goes the extra mile for others in love.

DAY 4 - GO WITH GUIDANCE

Context God assures Moses of His presence and guidance as Moses is commissioned to lead the Israelites out of Egypt.

Key Verse Exodus 4:12 (ESV) “Now therefore go, and I will be with your mouth and teach you what you shall speak.”

Action Reflect on moments when you've felt unequipped or hesitant in a task or mission. Pray for assurance of God's guidance, wisdom, and provision in every endeavor, trusting in His presence and direction.

GO

DAY 5 - GO IN PEACE

Context Simon is accusing a sinful woman of unlawfully touching Jesus. Jesus speaks to the woman and tells her that her faith has set her free.

Key Verse Luke 7:48-50 (ESV) "And he said to the woman, 'Your sins are forgiven.' Then those who were at table with him began to say among themselves, 'Who is this, who even forgives sins?' And he said to the woman, 'Your faith has saved you; go in peace.'"

Action Your accuser has told you that you are not well, but the Savior has dismissed your case. You are set free! Pray for gratitude for your salvation, and to be free from all guilt and shame. The Savior has set you free from your charge.

DAY 6 - GO INTO NEW GROUND

Context God speaks to Joshua, instructing him to lead the Israelites across the Jordan River into the Promised Land after Moses' death.

Key Verse Joshua 1:2 (ESV) "Moses my servant is dead. Now therefore arise, go over this Jordan, you and all this people, into the land that I am giving to them, to the people of Israel."

Action Reflect on moments when you've encountered God has called you into a new challenge in life, similar to Joshua leading the Israelites into unfamiliar territories. Pray for strength, courage, and a reliance on God's promises and presence when stepping into new phases or facing daunting tasks.

GO

DAY 7 - GO WITH GOD'S CALLING

Context Emphasizes the need to prioritize God's call over earthly concerns.

Key Verse Luke 9:59-60 (ESV) "To another he said, 'Follow me.' But he said, 'Lord, let me first go and bury my father.' And Jesus said to him, 'Leave the dead to bury their own dead. But as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God.'"

Action Reflect on instances when earthly priorities competed with your commitment to follow Christ. Pray for clarity to prioritize God's call above all else and for the courage to step forward in obedience.

DAY 8 - GO IN JOY

Context Ezra gathered the people at the Water Gate in Jerusalem to read and teach the Law of Moses, which had been neglected during the years of exile. As the Law was read aloud, the people responded with great emotion, realizing the significance of God's Word and the ways they had fallen short.

Key Verse Nehemiah 8:10 (ESV) "Then he said to them, 'Go your way. Eat the fat and drink sweet wine and send portions to anyone who has nothing ready, for this day is holy to our Lord. And do not be grieved, for the joy of the Lord is your strength.'"

Action Reflect on moments when encountering God's Word brought joy and strength to your life. Pray for a heart that finds its joy and strength in the Lord, regardless of circumstances. If you are facing a lack of joy, turn to God's Word.

GO

DAY 9 - GO PURSUE HOLINESS

Context Paul is telling the Corinthians that they are temples of God. A temple has no place for anything that defiles it. We must protect our hearts as holy places unto God.

Key Verse 2 Corinthians 6:17-18 (ESV) "17 Therefore go out from their midst, and be separate from them, says the Lord, and touch no unclean thing; then I will welcome you, 18 and I will be a father to you, and you shall be sons and daughters to me, says the Lord Almighty."

Action Consider the call to avoid what is unclean and pursue holiness in your thoughts, actions, and associations. Reflect on practical steps you can take to uphold purity in your daily life. Pray for the desire and discipline to pursue a life marked by holiness and Godliness.

DAY 10 - GO IN GOD'S WAY

Context A Psalm of David expressing gratitude for God's forgiveness and the joy that comes from confessing sin. David reflects on the blessedness of being forgiven and guided by God.

Key Verse Psalm 32:8 (ESV) "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my eye upon you."

Action Consider God's divine counsel and its impact on your choices. Pray for discernment to heed God's counsel, knowing that His guidance leads to the best path.

GO

DAY 11 - GO FROM STRENGTH TO STRENGTH

Context In this psalm, the psalmist expresses deep longing for God's presence and dwelling place. The writer describes the joy of being in God's house and expresses a desire to be close to the Lord. The passage also highlights the blessings for those whose strength is in God, journeying through the valleys and finding refreshment along the way.

Key Verse Psalm 84:5-7 (ESV) Blessed are those whose strength is in you, in whose heart are the highways to Zion. As they go through the Valley of Baca they make it a place of springs; the early rain also covers it with pools. They go from strength to strength; each one appears before God in Zion.

Action A typical journey goes from strength to fatigue, but not with those who put their strength in God, they go from strength to strength.

DAY 12 - GO IN WISDOM

Context The emphasis is placed on the significance of holding on to instruction or wisdom, viewing it as essential for life. The father urges the son not to let go of wisdom but to guard it as it is invaluable, offering guidance, direction, and protection in life's journey.

Key Verse Proverbs 4:13 (ESV) Keep hold of instruction; do not let go; guard her, for she is your life.

Action Think on the value of wisdom and guidance in your life as portrayed in this verse. Reflect on how God's instruction has been life-giving and transformative. Pray for a deeper appreciation of God's guidance and a willingness to walk in His wisdom.

GO

DAY 13 - GO WITH GOD'S PROTECTION

Context In Luke 10, Jesus appoints seventy-two disciples and sends them out ahead of Him in pairs to every town and place where He was about to go. He instructs them about the urgency of the task, advising them to travel light and rely on the hospitality of those they visit. Jesus tells them that the harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few, urging them to pray for more workers for the harvest.

Key Verse Luke 10:3 (ESV) Go your way; behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves.

Action Going out in the world to share the gospel can be a scary task assigned by God. There may be people that come against us as wolves but we are required to function as lambs- filled with grace, mercy and love. We do not combat wolves, acting like wolves. Our actions should be pure. Even in this God's hand is on us.

DAY 14 - GO IN SPIRITUAL MATURITY

Context In Hebrews 6, the author discusses the importance of progressing in faith beyond foundational teachings. The chapter emphasizes spiritual growth and warns against spiritual stagnation or falling away from the faith. The writer desires that believers mature in their understanding of Christ's teachings, moving beyond the basics of repentance and faith, and advancing toward a deeper comprehension of God's truths and promises

Key Verse Hebrews 6:1 (ESV) "Therefore let us leave the elementary doctrine of Christ and go on to maturity, not laying again a foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God."

Action It's time to move past the ABC's. God has more! There is greater Knowledge of God, Greater obedience in God. This is a year to go deeper, get off the baby bottle and take steps into the more that God has for you.

GO

DAY 15 - GO IN REPENTANCE

Context This passage encourages believers to hold fast to their faith in Christ, warning against willful sin and the rejection of the truth after receiving knowledge of it.

Key Verse Hebrews 10:26 (ESV) "For if we go on sinning deliberately after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins,"

Action When we go on sinning with the knowledge of the truth, we have rejected the sacrifice for our sins. The writer says it is like "one who has trampled underfoot the Son of God...profaned the blood of the covenant by which he was sanctified...has outraged the Spirit of grace. But do not be discouraged and do not run away. Put your faith in God. Choose not to go on sinning, but go in repentance.

DAY 16 - GO IN GOD'S PROVISION

Context Solomon is sharing the difference between the wicked and the righteous. If one gains because of wickedness, he will reap wickedness. If one gains because of righteousness, one shall gain that of the righteous. When he says the righteous will not go hungry, he is not talking a physical hunger, he is talking amongst our souls.

Key Verse Proverbs 10:3 (ESV) "The Lord does not let the righteous go hungry, but he thwarts the craving of the wicked".

Action When Solomon says this, he is not talking about a physical hunger. This is not something that money can buy to nourish us, it is only a way of living that can nourish us. When we choose to live in righteousness, our souls are not longing. We are satisfied because we have chosen the way of the Lord. When we gain off of wickedness our souls become frustrated and angry. Even when our body is hurting, in the greatest of affliction our souls are satisfied. Choose righteous living and God will provide for your weary soul.

GO

DAY 17 - GO, EVEN TO THE UNLIKELY

Context The Lord speaks to Ananias in a vision about Saul coming to the faith and Saul has seen in a vision about a man named Ananias laying hands on him to regain his sight. Ananias expresses to God that he has heard of this man and the evil he has done, but God tells him that he is an instrument for him.

Key Verse Acts 9:15 (ESV) "But the Lord said to him, 'Go, for he is a chosen instrument of mine to carry my name before the Gentiles and kings and the children of Israel.'"

Action God chose Saul, a man that had a terrible reputation among the Christian community. Yet, Ananias contended with God because of his past. Has the Lord ever told you to be a witness and to help someone even with you knowing the wickedness that they have done? God's blood is for all, even the people that have done harm to you! That is the miracle. That God would still use people that are broken.

DAY 18 - GO WITH PRAISE!

Context The psalmist is praying for saving against the ungodly. He is asking God for deliverance. For God to send his light and truth. He knew that God would answer his prayer and he would celebrate by going to the altar of the Lord and offer him a praise.

Key Verse Psalm 43:4 (ESV) "Then I will go to the altar of God, to God my exceeding joy, and I will praise you with the lyre, O God, my God."

Action Under the new covenant we do not bring sacrifices of animals because Jesus paid the price for our sins. We can remember the altar in which Jesus sacrificed and we can bring a praise unto God. Hebrews 13:15 tells us "Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name." Our praise is an incense to God!

GO

DAY 19 - GO AND PRAY

Context Jesus is teaching the disciples about some spiritual disciplines and he is teaching them how to pray. He teaches them that a private prayer life is more valuable than those that just stand in public and pray what they do not mean.

Key Verse Matthew 6:6 (ESV) "But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you."

Action Jesus himself entered solitude often in prayer. His prayers were directed towards God, not man. He teaches his disciples that the ultimate goal of prayer is to be aimed at the Father. It is not to impress those around us. The secret place is a place where we cannot impress others but rather an intimate connection between you and God. What does your prayer life look like? Are you creating a routine of solitude and alone time with God?

DAY 20 - GO TO THE HOUSE OF THE LORD

Context During David's time there was never a temple, but there was a tabernacle and it was called the house of the Lord. There was a gathering taking place and this made David's heart filled with joy.

Key Verse Psalm 122:1 (ESV) I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go to the house of the Lord!"

Action God's house is not a burden, it is a blessing. Gathering together in worship and prayer should be something that brings us Joy and make our hearts glad. We should go into the house of the Lord with gladness.

GO

DAY 21 - GO DESPITE FEELING UNEQUIPPED


Context God calls Jeremiah to be a prophet to the nations, despite Jeremiah's feelings of being too young.

Key Verse Jeremiah 1:6-8 (ESV) “Then I said, “Ah, Lord God! Behold, I do not know how to speak, for I am only a youth.” But the Lord said to me, “Do not say, ‘I am only a youth’; for to all to whom I send you, you shall go, and whatever I command you, you shall speak. Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you to deliver you, declares the Lord.”

Action God calls Jeremiah, but Jeremiah claims that he is too young to be used by God. How often do we feel unequipped for the call that God has placed on our life? You may have heard the saying, God doesn't call the equipped, He equips the called. God will be your mouth, God will be your guide. Don't allow your weakness hinder you from missing what God has called you to.
